Episode 18: Conflict History from Balfour to 1967

Guest: Dr. Muriel Asseburg

Bio: Dr. Muriel Asseburg is one of Germany's most respected Middle East experts and a leading authority on conflict analysis and policy advising. She is a Senior Fellow in the Africa and Middle East Research Group at the Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik (SWP), where she also leads the thematic area "Autocratization as a Challenge for German and European Politics." Dr. Asseburg regularly advises the German government on foreign policy questions and is frequently consulted as an expert in the media. Her extensive research on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, regional security, and political developments in the Middle East is highly regarded for its depth, clarity, and policy relevance.

In this Episode: This episode explores the conflict history from the Balfour Declaration to 1967. Topics include the role of the British Empire, the origins and escalation of the conflict, including the UN Partition Plan and the Nakba, and the parallel Jewish exodus from Arab countries and Iran. Dr. Asseburg also examines the rise of Palestinian movements such as the PLO and Hamas, and developments on the Israeli side including the emergence of the Likud party and the religious right. The discussion highlights the lasting impact of historical decisions and international actors on current regional dynamics, providing listeners with a nuanced understanding of this phase of the conflict history.
